





Take A Hike to Tres Pistolas Trail Head in Tijeras Canyon, New Mexico-- a birder's album with Cecilie Bodman



Lets hike a lower elevation canyon dominated by pinyon-juniper and southern evergreen oaks. There are some Ponderosas and Beautiful views of the South Peak of the Sandias. Hiking is moderate to strenuous. Elevation is about 6,300 ft.

This is a world renown trail for people who love to watch birds. Birders come from around the world to hike this trail!

Early in the spring, often by mid-April, **Scott's Oriole** arrive to begin the chores of defending a territory and

pairing up. The melodic song is reminiscent of snippets from the Western Meadowlark's carol. By mid-May, nest building is underway, and June finds the couple gathering food for the young.

Unlike the familiar Bullock's and many other orioles, Scotts Oriole may weave its nest rather close to the ground, in Juniper, Mountain Mahogany a yucca, or even a clump of Mistletoe. Beargrass and Desert Prickly Pear are present through the desert grassland/juniper-oak savannah at the lower parts of the area, good habitat for Scott's Oriole.





Typical birds of the pygmy oak-piñon-juniper woodland include Spotted Towhee, Curve-billed Thrasher, Juniper Titmouse Northern Mockingbird, and Black-chinned Hummingbird Other breeding birds include the Crissal Thrasher, Broad-tailed Hummingbird, Bushtit, Ashthroated Flycatcher, Black-headed Grosbeak, Bullock's Oriole, Canyon Towhee, Rufous-crowned Sparrow, Redtailed Hawk, Kestrel and Golden Eagle.

Take the Carnuel exit at the eastern edge of Albuquerque on I-40 heading east. Parking is \$3.

Lets meet at the Range on Wyoming at 8am or at the trail head at 9:30 on May 16th.

The Challenge of Combining Households

My client Lena wrote with the good news that she was engaged to Daniel, the man of her dreams, but that moving in with him presented challenges. When a couple moves in together and combines furniture, art, and decorations, they often end up with more than they need, and sometimes things one person doesn't like. Fortunately, Feng Shui principles can help Lena and Daniel decide what to keep and what to toss.

The bedroom is the most challenging, and also the most important, room for any couple. Lena wanted to know if she should move her furniture or use Daniel's. I advised Lena that the first decision was to make sure both she and Daniel liked all of the bedroom furniture. If any piece didn't fit in with the others, or if one of them truly disliked it, it was a better Feng Shui choice to replace it all.

Next, Lena wondered about the photo of Daniel's deceased grandfather that he kept on his dresser. I explained that the only photos in a master bedroom should be of the couple - no children, parents, grandparents, friends, especially if they're deceased. Photos of relatives should be displayed in the Family Area or Helpful People Area, and moving the grandfather's picture to a more public area would better honoring his memory. I recommended she use this as an opportunity to take an engagement photo for their bedroom.

Daniel kept a teddy bear on his bed that he long ago received as a birthday present from his now-grown daughter. That bear had to go, especially since Daniel's relationship with his daughter was currently strained. Instead, I suggested displaying a current photo of the daughter in their family room near a picture of Lena and Daniel to symbolize a healthy relationship among the three of them.

Lena didn't like the two black ceramic cats that Daniel bought on a business trip to China before he met Lena. While Feng Shui principles do suggest keeping things in pairs in the bedroom, if Lena doesn't like the cats they shouldn't be in the bedroom. I recommended that Daniel move the cats to his home office as a reminder of his business travels, and that together the couple pick out a pair of objects to display in their bedroom.

Creating Clarity Challenge

Have you ever felt challenged? I have, most recently when I sat down to write this article. This wasn't the first challenge of my life, either. If you're like me, chances are pretty good you've lost count of the number of difficult situations, unexpected changes and impossibly challenging people in your life, of circumstances that have demanded special effort on your part. I'm in the process of completing a Masters degree in the art of avoiding challenges that leave me feeling vulnerable or incapable, and I've already earned a PhD in Procrastination, Avoidance, Complaining and Cringing at Challenges.

Although we tend to flinch at challenges, they do have an upside: Challenges can stretch us to develop new and existing skills, help us tap into our creativity, and strengthen our resilience. It's simply a matter of RISE-ing to the occasion. The next time you find yourself in a challenging situation, try these steps:

- **Recognize** Acknowledge that you are facing a challenge. Doing so actually shifts where you experience the stress of a challenge in your brain, from the reactive amygdala to the problem-solving pre-frontal cortex;
- Investigate Once you've accepted the fact that you're facing a challenge, ask yourself: 1. What is so important about meeting this challenge? When we are consciously aware of what we want, or how we want to be, we can begin to understand what values we will be honoring as we work through the challenge. 2. What is causing this situation to be challenging? As you look at what is causing your reaction, you will begin to uncover your reasons for feeling stuck or not wanting to step up to the task at hand;
- Shift Once you discover your trigger(s), congratulate yourself: You just gifted yourself the opportunity to choose between your original reaction to your challenge, or a try on a new viewpoint! When you are in choice, you offer yourself the opportunity both to trust and build your skills and abilities. Choose how you want to approach your challenge, then:
- Execute Without thinking, take a breath and step into your challenge as you look through the lens of your new perspective. Now open your eyes (if they were closed): Take a look around. You are still alive. Take another step. Know that you may have to evaluate and adjust as you move forward.

How challenging was writing this article? Once I RISE-ed, my PhD in Procrastination was no longer applicable. That's one certificate I won't be framing and hanging on the wall.

CHALLENGE

Traditionally, I have considered a Challenge to be an invitation---to surmount an obstacle, or

clear a hurdle, and emerge on the other side, more abundant and successful than before. My father always taught me to land on my feet, and both parents encouraged me to expand my education and opportunities, so I could meet whatever Challenge life might offer.

Some Challenges are foisted upon us, unbidden (divorce, tornado). Some, we choose (launching a business, attending graduate school). Regardless of whether we are chosen, or choose (or a combination of both), the principles of tackling a Challenge remain the same. The Chinese proverb tells us: "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step!" You can only open one door at a time. We can guide a horse with a harness, and steer a boat with a rudder, but we cannot even control our own tongues. My grandfather used to say, "If you can't say something nice, don't say anything." And he never SPOKE! I wonder what was going through HIS mind?

There is no Challenge like writing about Challenge. Just as I began contemplating this piece, a quotation arrived via email:

"You've done it before. You can do it now. See the positive possibilities. Redirect the substantial energy of your frustration, and turn it into positive, effective, unstoppable, determination."

~Ralph Marston [I think I'll laminate it and carry that one in my purse!]

Challenge confronts us at every turn. Sometimes, I feel like a Chinese acrobat spinning 25 plates on 24 long sticks. The object of the game is to keep them all in the air! Once, at the age of 26, I asked my wise, 86-year-old Cherokee landlady, "What is the meaning of Life?" Her reply? "Hell if I KNOW!" Perhaps the kind of counsel I truly sought could more readily be found in "The Invitation" by Oriah Mountain Dreamer, or "Desiderata," by Max Erhmann, or Epictetus's writings on living well. I invite you to examine each one, and add your favorite paradigms, to guide you in addressing your own personal Challenge, yet to come.

As for me, I rely on Helen Keller and Robert Frost, whose words perennially shape my epistemology for mastering the next Challenge which beckons my attention:

Keller: "Life is either a daring adventure, or it is nothing."

Frost: "Two roads diverged in a wood, and I---I took the one less traveled by, and that has made all the difference!"



Three good reasons to buy a home now

Looking for compelling reasons to buy a home? Let's start with this finding from the Federal Reserve's *Survey of Consumer Finances*¹: A homeowner's net worth is over 36 times greater than that of a renter. Yes - 36 times greater.

Every 3 years, the Federal Reserve Board publishes its *Survey of Consumer Finances*, collecting "information about family incomes, net worth, balance sheet components, credit use, and other financial outcomes." It may not be the easiest reading, but it's full of interesting statistics about family finances, and this information really caught my eye.

Here's the breakdown.

The average American family has a net worth of \$81,200. Of that net worth, 61.4 percent (\$49,856) is in home equity. The median net worth of American *homeowners* is \$194,500. The median net worth for *renters* is \$5,400. That's a 36 fold difference. Wow!

Need another reason to buy?

The National Association of Realtors® (NAR) released a study² that shows a widening gap between income and rental costs. NAR Chief Economist Lawrence Yun said, "In the past five years, a typical rent rose 15 percent while the income of renters grew by only 11 percent. The gap has worsened in many areas as rents continue to climb and the accelerated pace of hiring has yet to give workers a meaningful bump in pay." The study points out that those who were able to buy a home were insulated from rising housing costs since most take out 30 year fixed rate mortgages with established monthly payments. Furthermore, a typical homeowners' net worth climbs because of increases in home values and declining mortgage balances, while renters feel the pinch of increasing housing costs every year.

Here's another consideration.

Some people feel that taking on a mortgage to buy a home is too great a responsibility. But if you are paying rent, you are probably paying a mortgage. The question is, 'who benefits: You or your landlord?'

A paper³ published by The Joint Center for Housing Studies of Harvard University puts it this way:

Households must consume housing whether they own or rent. Not even accounting for more favorable tax treatment of owning, homeowners pay debt service to pay down their own principal while households that rent pay down the principal of a landlord plus a rate of return. That's yet another reason owning often does—as Americans intuit—end up making more financial sense than renting.

If you take out a 30 year fixed rate mortgage, that portion of your housing expenses will not increase. I don't think you can say the same about rent. And you will be growing the equity in *your* home, not your landlord's.

's Dog Treats



Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° F.
- 2. Mix the wet ingredients: pumpkin, peanut butter, grated zucchini, apple cider vinegar & coconut oil in a bowl.
- 3. Mix dry ingredients in a large bowl: rice flour, flax seed meal, wheat germ, & flax seeds. Stir in the wet ingredient mix & add in the chicken broth, (more liquid maybe needed to keep mixture together). Divide into 4 balls.
- 4. Roll out dough ball between parchment paper, 1/8" consistent thickness in rectangular shape to fit baking sheet. Discard top parchment paper, use for next baking tray. Transfer rectangular shaped dough with the bottom parchment paper to baking sheet. Use pizza cuter to cut dough in parallel strips to create a checkerboard of 1" squares. Use a ruler to help cut straight lines.
- 5. Bake 25-35 minutes slightly brown. If you prefer a softer treat, bake for 15-20 minutes. Remove from oven and cool. This recipe uses 4 baking sheet/trays.

These treats are soft & are very tasty. Recipe makes enough treats to fill a little more than 3 quart storage container with some to share with dog friends & keep in tins around the house. You can keep the dog treat crisps up to 1 week at room temperature in an airtight container or in an airtight container in the refrigerator up to 4 weeks.

Pumpkin Zucchini Peanut Butter Treats

Ingredients:

- 1 can (15oz) pumpkin (not pie filling)
- ½ cup of peanut butter
- 1 ¼ cup (1 medium size) grated zucchini
- 2 cups rice flour (or any flour)
- 1 cup flax seed meal
- ½ cup wheat germ
- 1 cup flax seeds
- ½ cup of chicken broth (low sodium)
- 1.5 tablespoons apple cider vinegar
- ½ cup coconut oil
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon

*Parchment paper for rolling out the dough, pizza cutter, ruler for cutting straight lines & a dog to snoopervise.
