Creating Clarity Encourage

Have you ever noticed how easy it is to offer encouragement to others? While he's certain he isn't qualified, you know your husband has the skills and experience to land his dream job. Though she's frustrated, you encourage your child to learn to tie her shoes. Yet offering encouragement to ourselves can be difficult. Though you love the music and you *really* want to dance, why can't you step out onto the dance floor? Or encourage yourself to have that difficult conversation with your co-worker? Or summon the courage to get the Goofy tattoo you've been dreaming about?

Science provides an answer: A part of our brain - the amygdala – is wired to protect us from danger, both real and perceived. When you dream of doing something that is outside of your comfort zone, your amygdala can believe this is dangerous and spring into action. It can give you a thousand reasons not to approach your co-worker, sign up for dance lessons, or get that tattoo.

But your amygdala isn't always right. Though they may be tall, there are mountains we want to climb, and with some self-encouragement, we can! With some practice and patience, you can learn to soothe your amygdala and empower yourself. You can grow your ability to encourage yourself by following these steps:

- Congratulate Yourself! Just thinking about doing something that's outside your comfort zone is courageous, and encouraging!
- Acknowledge "The Critic". The Critic, aka your amygdala, wants to keep you safe. It will tell you you're not coordinated enough, brave enough, smart enough, you name it. And it's not going away. When you acknowledge what it's whispering (or yelling), you activate brain circuits that can counter your fears.
- ❖ Identify the Positives. Consider the benefits of stepping outside of your comfort zone, and write them down. Will a Goofy tattoo have you smiling? Will having that difficult conversation with your co-worker open the door for finishing the big project on time
- Create a Plan. Writing down the steps provides a path for you to follow.
- Think of someone who inspires you. Do you admire Tina Turner, who's still hot at 76 years old? Your Uncle Bob, who started a wildly successful widget company? What would they be telling you? When you hear The Voice, channel Tina and allow her to inspire you to take the next step.

When you encourage yourself, you're instilling courage. That's huge. It takes some work. It's extremely empowering. And a Goofy tattoo will look good on you!

Acknowledgement. Effective encouragement may take the form of specific acknowledgment of the smallest of steps.

Vulnerability. On the inside, a young, vulnerable part of ourselves, who had a difficult experience in a particular area of life, may need attention. A former negative experience might have told us that we couldn't do something or failure wasn't ok.

Resources. Find a buddy with whom to collaborate. When needed, gather a team.

Belief. Underneath it all is belief. Believe in inner strength and the capability to figure it out with the right support. See the deeper and wider picture. Belief connects the dots of support. Belief is one hand reaching out to the other knowing it is possible.

I would like to take the opportunity for this month's theme to actually ENCOURAGE you towards a goal of self-care. This can start very simply with your eating habits.

There is so much medicine provided through the food that we eat. Did you know that **turmeric** has been proven to be more effective than 14 pharmaceutical drugs, including aspirin and Celebrex? It is also linked to lower rates of Alzheimer's and many kinds of cancers. Just adding around a bit to your daily diet can improve many aspects of your life. My husband and I have been taking a mixture of **turmeric**, **true cinnamon**, **ginger**, **black pepper**, **and cayenne** simmered in milk for breakfast everyday for several months. It has improved our skin, digestive health, aching joints, and energy levels. Not to mention the fact that there are studies that are linked to weight-loss for many of those ingredients.

Ceylon "true" cinnamon (also known as Mexican cinnamon and canela) is very different from what we perceive as cinnamon in the United States. What we sell here as "cinnamon" is cassia (a relative of cinnamon). Cassia has the red hot, apple pie flavor that we know and love, while true cinnamon is much more citrusy and sweet. **True cinnamon** is linked to helping to regulate blood sugar levels to combat diabetes and helps lower cholesterol.

Cayenne, a capsicum, is a chile that is loaded with capsaicin. Capsaicin is the compound in chiles that make them "hot" and makes your nerve endings wince. It also stimulates mucus linings (thus the runny noses) which prevents ulcers and stomach cancer. In countries that eat more chile-laden cuisines populations have significantly lower rates of cancers and digestive problems. If you have an ulcer this can exacerbate them but if not it helps to prevent them by increasing the mucus lining in your stomach. Not to mention the endorphin rush you get from eating hot foods (a free high) and the pain blocker Substance P that is released every time hot foods are eaten. The link to weight loss is highly proven, as well. So, to summarize, New Mexico keep eating your hot chile!!

I encourage you to use this month to incorporate some healthy food based medicines into your diet. Fresh fruits, vegetables, and- as always- spices!

Santa Fe Real Estate Continues to Offer Opportunity

Santa Fe has done it again. Our City Different is on another "Top" list. This time, Santa Fe is on *Money* magazine's "Best in Travel Awards – Top 7 Domestic Destinations." The category was based on "best travel experiences at the best prices." More recognition came from travel writer Samantha Brown in *USA Today*, who called Santa Fe "one of Ten Best Mother-Daughter Getaways."

I share these as a reminder that Santa Fe is a very desirable location – and a great place to buy real estate.

When you look for places to invest your money, there are checking, savings, money market and certificate of deposit accounts currently paying 1 percent interest if you're lucky. There are 10 Year Treasury Notes near 2 percent, and the US Stock Market continues to have trouble breaking through the 18,000 level.

By contrast, real estate continues to provide opportunities, and Santa Fe is a leading 2nd home market. Home loan rates are in the 3's and 4's, and you may have after-tax savings that lower your effective rate to the 1's to 3's, depending on your situation. (Always consult your tax advisor.) And if you are buying a long-term or vacation rental property, the payments from renters and vacationers can help cover your mortgage. A 15 year loan will bring you to full ownership faster than a 30 year loan, and you'll be building your net worth at the same time.

What's the status of our housing market in Santa Fe? Last month I wrote that we are trending to a seller's market, and I believe that First Quarter 2016 statistics released by the Santa Fe Association of Realtors support this.³ Overall, Santa Fe City median prices increased by almost 8.8 percent over the same period in 2015, but some areas were up by well over 20 percent. Housing inventory was down by 6.7 percent. When you combine increased prices with lower inventory, we are in a seller's market, which is great for potential price appreciation.

If you're thinking of buying a second home, *U.S. News & World Report* published a very useful article that's worth a read. "What to Know Before Buying a Home at Your Favorite Vacation Spot" covers many issues to consider before buying, including whether you can afford the home, what rules may govern renting, how often you'll really visit, and protecting the home when it's vacant.

Wondering what's happening nationally in the vacation (and investment) home markets? The National Association of Realtors (NAR) 2016 Investment and Vacation Home Buyers Survey⁵ outlines the latest trends, and vacation home purchases are hot. While the number of purchases dropped from the previous year, 2015 had the second highest number of vacation home purchases since 2006. Twenty five percent of those vacation homes were purchased in our region – the West. Another recent NAR report⁶ confirms our local statistics on low inventory.

So whether you are buying your first home, moving up to a larger home, downsizing, adding rental properties to your portfolio or buying that dream vacation home, Santa Fe real estate is worthy of your consideration. And if you need more encouragement, consider this: Freddie Mac reported in mid-May that the rate for the 30 year fixed rate mortgage was at its lowest point in 3 years!





Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° F.
- 2. Mix the peanut butter with mashed bananas. Beat in the eggs. Stir in the chicken broth.
- 3. Mix dry ingredients in a large bowl.
- 4. Mix all ingredients until thoroughly combined, kneading with hands. Add more liquid or flour, if needed. Divide into 4 balls.

Roll out dough ball between parchment paper, 1/8" consistent thickness in rectangular shape to fit baking sheet. Discard top parchment paper & save for next baking tray. Use pizza cutter to cut the dough into 1/2" parallel strips. This technique makes the process supper fast. Transfer rectangular shaped dough with the bottom parchment paper to baking sheet. Don't move the strips—leave them in place on baking sheet.

Banana Peanut Butter Treats Ingredients:

- 1 cup rolled oats, uncooked
- ½ cup wheat germ
- ¼ cup flax seeds
